The Seawolves of Stony Brook put 537 yds of offense in the pot and cooked a 41-31 victory over the Liberty Flames to claim their first outright conference championship. Stony Brook became the first team to finish 6-0 in the Big South and have scored 40+ points in seven consecutive games. Seawolves QB, Kyle Essington passed for 250 yds and the Batman and Robin backfield of Miguel Maysonet and Brock Jackolski teamed up for 279 vds rushing. Liberty Sr. QB and Walter Payton Award contender. Mike Brown, completed 23 of 36 passes for 361 yds and rushed for 22 yds. After three quarters, tied at 31, the difference was Stony Brook, as they played composure football and kept Liberty off the score board. Congrats to head coach Chuck Priore and the Stony Brook Seawolves!

THE SELECTION PROCESS

10 teams have an automatic bid as their conference champion. The other 10 are selected based on performance, strength of schedule, record, and Division I wins. Jim O'day, FCS Selection Committee Chair, is adamant about selecting at-large teams that have seven Division I wins. As this doesn't disqualify teams from earning an at-large bid, history holds that no six Division I win team has entered the post-season as an at-large. Below is an at-large snapshot:

Appointed....Eastern Kentucky had a solid season with a head-to-head victory over Jacksonville State, which probably made the difference in their selection. **James Madison** dropped three conference games to the top CAA squads, which didn't hurt them. The Dukes have playoff experience and potential to make moves. After a 1-3 start, **Central Arkansas** won their final seven games of the season in good fashion. Two of their three losses were to FBS teams and the 3rd loss to #1 ranked Sam Houston State. The Bears will be entering the playoffs with a much confidence.

Disappointed....Liberty is frustrated another year. The Flames just can't make it out of the Big South smoothly. LU had a good season to show for it. **Portland State**, **Youngstown State**, **Illinois State**, **and Indiana State** each loss their final games and wiped away their playoff hopes. These teams had key wins throughout the season but couldn't compete with other bubble teams to make the cut. **Delaware** had wins against CAA foes Towson and Old Dominion, but losses to UMass and Rhode Island hurt them. Wins over MEAC's worst, Delaware State and Div II, West Chester didn't help. **Georgetown** had their best season in years but had to win the Patriot League to get in, as no at-large teams stream from the Patriot. **Bethune-Cookman** ended at 2nd best in MEAC play. They played FBS inter-state foe, Miami, tough earlier this year and was the only conference team to defeat MEAC champ, Norfolk State. The MEAC wasn't strong enough this year to place an at-large.
