Hats off to..... Charleston Southern's win against Div II opponent Shorter College broke a 15-game losing streak for the Buccaneers....N. Arizona scored the most points ever against Big Sky foe, Montana, and got their first win in Missoula since 1986. They shocked the Grizzlies, 41-31.... C. Arkansas breaks a 3-game losing streak to last year's FCS regular season undefeated Sam Houston State. The Bears



skid last week

- won 24-20 and lead the head-to-head series 4-3....SE Louisiana kept McNeese State scoreless in the second half and break a 6-game losing streak to the Cowboys. They won 25-24 at home.

## **Dominion over all**

Old Dominion's Sophomore QB, Taylor Heinicke threw for a Division I record 730 yards in a 64-61 barn-burner against CAA opponent New Hampshire. He completed 55-of-79 attempts and threw for five touchdowns.

The Tigers of Tennessee State look to continue their winning ways against the visiting Golden Lions of UAPB. These two teams aren't usually in headline stories, but they are starting the 2012 season on good notes. Tenn State is 4-0 for the first time since 2008. UAPB is ranked #6 in overall FCS defense. Tenn State is no stranger to competing against SWAC opponents- holding a .630 winning edge all-time. The teams haven't faced each other since 1947 so the matchup will be quite a reunion for these HBCU's. Three-time SuperBowl champion and UAPB head coach, Monte Coleman should keep the game a close one in Nashville. Kickoff is at 6pm ET.
