Illinois State's Darrelyn Dunn also has 11 TD's and 710 yds rushing this season and is ranked 4th in the conference. The key for Indiana State is to stop the passing game- Illiniois State has 3 of the top 7 WR's in the MVC lead by Tyrone Walker with 792 receiving yds and 5 TD's.
