• 8 FCS upsets over FBS programs:

Towson 33, UConn 18 Southern Utah 22, South Alabama 21 Samford 31, Georgia State 21 North Dakota State 24, Kansas State 21 Eastern Washington 49, Oregon State 46 McNeese State 53, South Florida 21 Northern Iowa 28, Iowa State 20 Eastern Illinois 40, San Diego State 19

- Four of the five newcomers get their first win in the FCS: Charlotte, Stetson, Mercer, and Abilene Christian
- Charleston Southern beats Citadel for 1st time since 2006 and get their first road win against an FCS opponent since 2009 (Presbyterian)
- Largest margin of victory: 78 pts. Abilene Christian 84, Concordia (AL) 6. There were 3 other games with 70+ pt margins.



NDSU has defeated an FBS team four straight years. Friday night they stunned defending Big 12 champ Kansas State, 24-21.

Eastern Washington's upset win over Oregon State was only the 3rd FCS team to beat a ranked FBS team. Seven of the eight upsets had payouts totaling \$2.3M. GAME OF THE WEEK

North Carolina A&T at #21 App State

Non-intentional for us to have App State in consecutive "game of the week" feature. This game was chosen with implications of an upset. Historically, A&T hasn't defeated a Southern Conference team since 2004 (beat Elon) and App State since 1993. But they are (expected to be) a different Aggie squad this season.

Although they were not allowed to have 2013 spring practice due to poor academic progress rate scores, A&T made (single-year score) necessary improvements, had the restrictions lifted by the NCAA and are postseason & MEAC championship eligible. Coach Rod Broadway will return all four starters from a secondary that posted the #1 pass defense, and seven starters from a defense that was ranked #2 in total and scoring defense in all of FCS.

App State's 6 pts against Montana last weekend was there lowest scoring output against an FCS team since 1998. They have a lot to make up for this Saturday at home. Will the Mountaineers continue their 40 pt scoring average against the Aggies all-time, or will the Aggies' defense help pull off an upset? This regional rival takes place in the FCS' highest attendance stadium (Kidd-Brewer Stadium- 26,000 avg in 2012) at 6pm ET.
