- Alcorn State's 21-16 win over Ark-Pine Bluff was only the 3rd time they've beat a defending SWAC champion since the Braves won the title in 1994.
- Eastern Illinois and Maine came pretty close in FBS upsets with Northern Illinois and Northwestern, respectively.
- Largest margin of victory: 76 pts. Ohio State 76, Florida A&M 0
- # of shut-outs: 9
- # of OT games: 2 Jacksonville St 32, Georgia St 26; Southern Utah 24, Sacramento St 21
- Largest accumulative attendance in 2013: James Madison- 63,119

MEAC woes

- Although Florida A&M suffered its worst loss in program history to Ohio State, it collected its highest game payout ever at \$900,000. That's higher than 10 of the 35 FBS bowl games and the highest FCS payout ever. I guess no pain, no gain.
- Coaches decided to play a 12 minute 4th quarter (instead of 15) in the Miami vs. Savannah State game last Saturday. The Hurricanes were up 77-7 entering the period.
- Hampton gave up 40 first half pts to Coastal Carolina and suffered a 33 pt loss...it's largest margin of defeat against an FCS team in 5 seasons.
- Norfolk State has its first 0-3 start since 2005. Offense has posted 18 pts over the first 3 games of the season...the Spartans lowest first 3-game output since 1964.

Ancient 8

The Ivy League began the season last weekend with 6 of the 8 teams victorious in non-conference play. Columbia ran into a tough, ranked Fordham squad, and Princeton couldn't hold onto a lead with Lehigh in a close one at home. Harvard's **Conner Hempel** and Dartmouth's **Dayln Williams** are among the **top 5 offensive leaders**; **Yale**'s at #3 in **team offense**; and **Brown and Penn** are #2 and #3, respectively in **team defense**. Nice start for the Ivy's!
