- Samford broke a 5 game losing streak to App State by beating the struggling Mountaineers, 34-10 on the road. First win for the Bulldogs against App State since they've joined the SOCON in 2008.
- SE Louisiana beat Stephen F. Austin, 56-14...the most points ever scored and largest margin of victory by either team head-to-head dating back to 1950.
- Cal Poly's 47-0 route over Weber State was their largest shutout victory over a Big Sky opponent and first shutout since 2006 (beat Savannah St, 55-0)
- Largest margin of victory: 59 pts- Auburn 62, Western Carolina 3
- \# of shut-outs: 3
- \# of OT games: 4- two of the four from the SWAC Conference.
- Largest accumulative attendance in 2013: James Madison- 107,349

These two Southland Conference teams have met 34 times dating back to 1951 with McNeese State owning 24 wins and sharing a tie. The Cowboys are looking to slow down star RB, Tim Flanders and the Bearkats, who have won the last two matchups and have represented the Southland in the last two consecutive national championships. In the last decade, when McNeese goes 5-1 (or better) they've not only beaten SHSU but made the post-season in that year.
Scoreboard alert! Cowboys are 3rd in the FCS in scoring at just under 44 pts per game....Sam Houston State is \#1 in rushing offense at 319 yds per game. A fight for tops of the Southland on Saturday at Cowboy (not Dallas) Stadium in Lake Charles, LA. Kickoff is at 8pm ET.
